## 4. Reports on the work of the past year, including Chair's report

A slide show (Lennart Ackzell) demonstrating IFFA 2015 activities was presented in connection with the Chair's report.

Chair Peter deMarsh gave a brief report on the highlights, important activities and the achievements in 2015.

The Chair reported that IFFA has improved during 2015 and are increasingly being listened to. The good progress was illustrated during the World Forestry Congress in Durban, where the stand together with FAO clearly showed the face of family forestry. The African Forest producer

organisations conference in Kenya in June gave an excellent contribution to the further development of international, regional and national networks and served as well as preparations for the World Forestry Congress.

The foundation of the new family forestry association member in Nepal has already proved the importance of organising small producers, and contributed to forest policy improvements in the country. During the terrible earthquake in Nepal, the new organisation actively participated in aiding the population. Partnering expertise from the forest sector in Germany proved as well the cooperation between family forestry countries.

The Oslo workshop compared tax politics and looked at policy trends that may encourage or discourage the marketing of timber. The experience exchange improved tax policy lobbying.

The new IFFA partnership agreement with the Farm and Forest Facility has been a great help for the activities in family forestry and small forest producer organisations.

Areas for improvement in 2016 are recruiting new members, increasing the efficiency of member communication and improved regional networking in Africa, Asia and South and Central America. The improved cooperation between the G3 alliances will continue.

The Chair thanked the Board members and the secretariat for their efforts in 2015. Bertrand Olivier underlined the good cooperation between PEFC and family forestry organisations and the important development of group certification schemes.

## 5. Economic report

The treasurer, Lorenz Klein won Wisenberg, presented the economic report. The treasurer presented as well the 2015 budget. The annual meeting expressed gratitude for the direct voluntary contributions from members and members that pay for attendance at events where their representatives participate on behalf of IFFA as well as their home organisation.
